ANNUAL MEETING

Our annual voters meeting will be February 4 at 10:30 AM. The agenda includes the election of church council members, adopting the endowment budget and setting our TIM missions goal. The vision planning committee will share the 3 potential mission statements they have developed for our congregation. All members of Immanuel age 18 and above are eligible to vote.

SIGN UP FOR CAMP!

Lutheran Island Camp Sunday will be February 11. LIC Director Stacy Lung will be with us that day to give us an update on camp. She will also be available to answer any questions about summer camps or camp in general. Sunday School children will be bringing home camp brochures next Sunday. Our endowment fund will be providing each child a campership of \$300 for a week-long camp and \$125 for a weekend camp. HIGHER THINGS

Higher Things is an organization in the LCMS that organizes summer youth conferences. 8 of our youth and 2 chaperones have registered for the Higher Things Youth Conference in Portland, Oregon in July. Our group will be traveling by Amtrak. To help support this event our youth will be doing an envelope fundraiser during lent. VICAR APPLICATION

The elders from Immanuel and Trinity met recently to complete an application for a vicar. The plan is for the vicar to live in the parsonage at Carlos. He would do most of the things our previous vicars have done: preaching and helping with the liturgy at our services, teaching confirmation, helping lead Bible Studies, and helping with our youth ministry, as well as leading worship twice a month at Trinity in Carlos. Vicarage assignments will be announced in April. Please keep this process in your prayers.

ASH WEDNESDAY

February 14 is Ash Wednesday. This will be the first of our Wednesday Lenten Services, which will be at 7 PM. This service will include the imposition of ashes. Join us as we enter into the 40 days of Lent.

We will have soup and sandwich suppers each Wednesday during Lent. Serving will start at 6 PM. Our youth will serve some of the suppers. If you’d like to help with a soup supper, there will be a sign up sheet at the narthex counter.

TOGETHER IN MISSION

It is a joy to belong to a circuit and a congregation that has a heart for missions. At our recent Circuit Forum and TIM meeting, we received updates on the several missionaries that we help support as a circuit. In addition Jacque Breman and Greg Wachter shared about the 3 villages in Malawi that now have clean drinking water through the buckets and water filters that were paid for by people in our circuit. In addition a large amount of preschool teaching supplies were gathered and sent to Malawi in the past year. Business people in our circuit donated the funds for a two room school house that will have 2 sections each of first and second grade students each day. There will be 35 first graders and 35 second graders in the morning and a different group of 35 students in each grade in the afternoon. The goal is to build a two room school for 3rd and 4th grade this year and continue until there are rooms for all 12 grades.

As a circuit we provided scholarships to help 2 pastors and 2 deaconess students finish their studies last spring. 4 more students are being supported this year. In addition to renewing our support to our current missionaries in the amount of \$22,500, we also voted to provide \$2,000 to Nathan Federwitz who is completing his training to be a missionary pilot with Lutheran Bible Translators and \$1,000 to Jacy Roste who is serving as a teacher with Youth With A Mission (YWAM) in Colorado. YWAM trains young adults for three months and then sends them overseas for three months of volunteer missionary work. Please help support our TIM Missionaries with your gift to our circuit TIM fund! ¹Thank you for Malawi Water Filter Kits & Buckets!

This story tells how our Circuit (LWML, churches and individuals) made safe drinking water possible for 220 families in Malawi. Without wells, many children and older church members have gotten sick, and even died, from contaminated river and stream water. **They need safe drinking water, until church village wells can be funded!**

Alexandria Circuit Pastors, churches, LWML, Lutheran Mission Center, Vacation Bible School, Men's Ministry and individuals raised funds this year (2023) that accomplished this goal! Funds were raised to purchase Water Filter Kits and plastic buckets. Water Filter Kits were shipped directly to Malawi. Funds for plastic buckets were sent to LCMS Africa Director's office, where our LCMS missionaries became involved with the project. Rev. Wowa, Chair of the Confessional Lutheran Church, trained Lutheran families how to install and maintain the water filters. Rev. Wowa and the families receiving these Filter Kits and buckets want to thank you!

LCMS WORKERS IN ASIA VISIT MEDAN!



LCMS Workers and their families gather on Thursday January 4 with GKLI leadership after worship according to the traditional GKLI Pattern.

Each January OIM workers in Asia and their families meet together for the All Asia Family Retreat. This provides us an invaluable opportunity for support, fellowship, pastoral care, Bible study, worship, theological conversations, advice, and the list could go on. Kali and I were overjoyed to host the team in Medan, Indonesia for this year's gathering.

Study and Worship at the Center

The retreat each year centers around study and worship with unstructured time in the afternoon for workers to seek edification in personally effective ways. Pastor Roger James led a study of Colossians, morning and evening worship, and officiated Epiphany Divine Service. Pastor Kevin Robson LCMS CMO came all the way from Saint Louis to be with us and offer the opportunity to communicate in a frank and face to face way.

The significance of this annual event for the support and endurance of OIM workers in Asia is difficult to overstate. Important moments created here help us to remain steadfast in the field God has called us with energy, joy, and zeal.

One important moment was inviting the GKLI leadership to worship with us Thursday morning. We worshiped in English and Indonesian following the GKLI Agenda. So the GKLI and LCMS folks could follow along in their own language.

Introducing GKLI Traditions and Leadership to OIM Workers in Asia

The GKLI has one order of worship. They do not change it for Pastor Conferences, feast days, or anything else. If they worship together they worship according to this pattern. It is part of their core identity. It is unique in Indonesia because explicitly forgives sins after the confession. It also incorporates a reading of the Small Catechism or Augsburg Confession.

After the service Bishop Siragih had the opportunity to address our group. He expressed his gratitude and appreciation that the LCMS used the GKLI service. For him it was affirming that the work and development of this service over the last generation has not been in vain. Many people commented afterward that the importance of the moment for our relationship with the GKLI was apparent.
